

A Couple of Bartenders Walk Into ...

Eight years ago, Marcella would never have imagined that her life would be what it is today. Back in September 2014, she and her daughter were on the precipice of homelessness. Marcella was earning money bartending, relying on a minimum wage salary plus tips. But the weekly income was inconsistent, and she had fallen behind on rent and was at risk of eviction. When Marcella reached out to Always Home, she was desperate for stability in her life. Always Home helped Marcella find a new apartment that fit her budget and secured the lease with the landlord by paying both the security deposit and first month's rent. For Marcella, the new apartment was the kick-start she needed to rekindle her confidence and the belief that she could do better.

Today, with hard work, grit and determination, Marcella is the proud co-owner of A Couple of Bartenders CT, a bar and beverage catering service. While working at a Clinton Art Society event this past Sunday, Marcella and her partner, Jeff, met world-famous Chef Jacques Pepin. Both Marcella and Jeff recalled that when they were growing up their parents and grandparents watched Chef Pepin on PBS. They spoke with him about his passion for cooking, family and his legacy work of The Jacques Pepin Foundation. Chef Pepin's foundation raises funds to support community kitchens that provide life skills and culinary training to adults with employment barriers because of prior homelessness, substance abuse, incarceration or a lack of skills, education or work history.

Marcella was excited to share with us that Chef Pepin has invited their business to provide drinks at an upcoming Summer fundraiser he hosts at his home in Madison to benefit his foundation. Along with great food and a game of boules, Chef Pepin's Summer soiree will include A Couple of Bartenders CT.




LET'S HAVE A HEART TO HEART

KINSHIP CARE



When a family crisis threatened the safety of her granddaughter, Angela immediately stepped up to raise her. She knew she could provide the 9-year-old with love and stability. What she didn't consider were the financial and physical challenges of parenting. Angela is a former paralegal who worked for a well-known lawyer until medical disabilities ended her career. Today, she lives frugally on Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI). Finding a new apartment was the first step to starting a new life with her granddaughter. But rents were high, inventory low and most places didn't accept pets. "I have had my dog for 11 years," said Angela, "since she was a baby and I would never give her up ever ever!" When Angela finally found a pet-friendly apartment,

despite having scrimped and saved, she didn't have enough money to secure the lease. "I saved money for the U-Haul and the movers which was hard," Angela explained. "If I had known about paying a prorated amount or the dog deposit I would've tried to save more." Frustrated and discouraged, Angela contacted Always Home.



Always Home's Social Worker, Marlynn Benker, who is also a grandmother and kindred animal lover, empathized with Angela's situation. Marlynn has a cat and dog of her own and recognizes that a beloved pet is an important family member. "Like Angela, I would never give up my pets," Marlynn shared. "Pets enhance comfort, health and well-being." Before she even got off the phone with Angela, Marlynn knew that Angela's housing stabilization plan would include a 7-pound pup named Princess.

Always Home helped Angela bridge the gap between her savings and what was needed to move in to a new apartment, including the required pet fee. Marlynn also worked with Angela to create a monthly budget and bolstered her housing stability by troubleshooting other issues. We paid additional rent which will free up resources for Angela, so she can catch up on car repair payments. We also assisted with the cost of summer camp so that Angela's granddaughter will have an enriching school break.

Raising a grandchild won't be easy, but Angela is grateful that Always Home was there for her at the start of her new journey.
