Rising rent prices, a shortage of affordable housing units, and increasing competition for available apartments are ongoing challenges that force low-income families into situations of housing insecurity. Many families who allocate over 30% of their income towards rent have a high housing cost-burden and are struggling to stay housed.

"Diane" is a single mother raising two daughters. To support her family, she juggles two jobs. From Monday through Friday, she works at a local daycare center. On weekends, she serves as a part-time caregiver for a disabled adult. Typically, with the two jobs, she manages to cover her rent and other bills. However, there was a brief period when she had to take time off work to care for her own mother, which left her short on funds to pay the rent and other monthly expenses. She called Always Home seeking assistance.

Always Home's Social Worker, Marlynn Benker, worked closely with "Diane" to assess her income and expenses. Together, they created a budget plan that ensured "Diane" could meet her financial obligations, while also setting aside a small amount in savings for a future emergency. It was agreed that Always Home would pay the past-due rent knowing that "Diane" would be able to maintain her housing stability after our intervention.

We're excited to introduce you to **Gabriella Trudelle** who recently joined us as Case Worker/Shelter Diversion Specialist. Always Home serves as a designated Family HUB for the 2-1-1-Eastern Coordinated Access Network (ECAN), a vital role within Connecticut's homeless response system. Gabriella is the Always Home staff member who offers case management services to families who are determined by 2-1-1 to be homeless or within 14 days of homelessness. With a bachelor's degree in Psychological Science, Gabriella represents the compassionate support system families need during their time of crisis. She shares, "I am so excited to be joining the amazing Always Home team and I look forward to using my skills to help the community."



Hellos are often followed by goodbyes. Today, we bid farewell to **Trisha Dani**, a cherished member of Always Home for the past eleven years. What began as a summer internship evolved into a full-time position as we soon recognized Trisha's intelligence, dedication, and steady demeanor. This education equipped her with the practical skills required for her position as a Case Worker/Shelter Diversion Specialist, where she assisted families in exploring options other than emergency shelter. Trisha also cared deeply, helping hundreds of families navigate their housing emergency with both patience and understanding. As Trisha steps down to spend more time with her two-year old son, we wish her all the best in this new chapter of her life.


